Public Meeting Minutes



Cutchin Storm Drainage Improvement Project

September 15, 2017



Charlotte-Mecklenburg Storm Water Services held its third public meeting on August 3 at Sharon Presbyterian Church to present the proposed improvements and begin the easement acquisition phase.

Meeting highlights

- Ben Lanzillotta introduced the project team, explained design progress and the beginning of the easement acquisition process which allows the City access to property during construction and for future maintenance. Easements do not reduce the size of one's property, but do create some limitations within the easement area. Impacted property owners were sent an information packet after the meeting.
- Property owners inquired about:
 - The impacts of the proposed riprap apron and if anything else can be used. The riprap apron is necessary to slow the water down to help deter erosion.
 - Extending the headwall and removing the use of riprap. Extending the headwall would have a larger impact to the property and would not eliminate the riprap apron.
 - The shift in alignment of the proposed pipe. The shift is to better align the new pipe with the channel.
